Quirky and Unusual Things to do in Boston Massachusetts



- 1. The Liberty Hotel**
Once a 19th-century prison that held notable inmates, it was beautifully transformed into a luxury hotel in 2007. Step inside to see original jail cells in the restaurant and fascinating history around the walls.



- 2. Brattle Book Shop**
One of America's oldest and largest used bookshops with three floors of books—and an outdoor courtyard filled with hundreds more. A book lover's paradise in the heart of Boston's downtown.



- 3. The Skinny House**
Boston's narrowest house is just 10.4 feet wide at its widest point! Built out of spite after the Civil War, it's a quirky slice of local history tucked away in the North End.



- 4. Hood Milk Bottle**
This giant milk bottle near the Boston Children's Museum was once an ice cream stand! A 15,000-pound icon and a fun photo stop for visitors of all ages.



- 5. Boston Tea Kettle**
A copper kettle that really steams! Once an ad for the Oriental Tea Company, it now sits above a Starbucks and has been a Boston landmark since the 1800s.



- 6. The Boston Stone**
Said to mark the centre of Boston, this historic stone is hidden in a building on Marshall Street. Nearby is the historic Green Dragon Tavern, established in 1654.



- 7. Edgar Allan Poe Statue**
Poe is captured rushing down Boylston Street with papers scattering from his briefcase and a raven by his side. A tribute to Boston's literary genius.



- 8. The Earl of Sandwich, Boston Common**
An octagonal building that was once a men's restroom (nicknamed the 'Pink Palace')! Now it's an Earl of Sandwich shop—grab a bite and admire the historic structure.



- 9. Mary Baker Eddy Library / The Mapparium**
A breathtaking three-story stained-glass globe showing the world as it was in the 1930s. A unique attraction with sound and LED lights that brings the map to life.



- 10. Scarlett O'Hara House**
Not a real house, but a beautiful mural of one! This painted façade in Beacon Hill creates a charming illusion that's well worth seeking out.
