BEST FREE ATTRACTIONS IN LONDON



TOP LANDMARKS & ICONIC SIGHTS

- Tower of London**
Admire this historic fortress from the outside and take in its impressive walls and moat.
- London Bridges**
Walk across and admire iconic bridges including Tower Bridge and Westminster Bridge.
- Houses of Parliament**
Marvel at the stunning Gothic architecture on the riverbank.
- Buckingham Palace**
See the royal residence and watch the Changing of the Guard (free to watch).
- Trafalgar Square and the Lions**
Visit Nelson's Column and the famous bronze lion statues.
- Red Telephone Box**
Snap a photo with one of London's most iconic symbols.
- Changing of the Guard**
Experience this colourful ceremony at Buckingham Palace, St James's Palace or Wellington Barracks.
- Sky Garden**
Enjoy panoramic views and beautiful gardens from the 43rd floor of the Walkie Talkie building. Free ticket required.
- Big Ben**
See London's famous clock tower at the heart of Westminster.
- Push a Trolley at Platform 9 ¾**
Pose with the trolley at King's Cross Station and relive Harry Potter magic.
- Walk the Thames River**
Stroll along the Thames Path and enjoy iconic views of London.
- Westminster Abbey (Exterior)**
Admire the magnificent Gothic abbey from the outside.
- Piccadilly Circus**
Soak up the buzz and bright lights of London's lively junction.
- Paddington Bear Statue**
Say hello to Paddington at Paddington Station.
- Wellington Arch**
Admire this grand triumphal arch and the Quadriga sculpture.

FREE LONDON MUSEUMS

- British Museum** – World treasures from ancient Egypt, Greece & Rome.
- Natural History Museum** – Explore Earth's wonders at this beautiful museum in South Kensington.
- Science Museum** – Discover incredible inventions, space travel and hands-on exhibits.
- Victoria and Albert Museum** – 5,000 years of art, design, fashion and creativity.
- Museum of London** – The city's history from Roman times to today.
- Museum of London Docklands** – The story of London as a global port city.
- Imperial War Museum** – Powerful exhibits on wars and conflict, especially WW1 & WW2.
- Design Museum** – Inspiring collections on design, art and culture.
- London Mithraeum** – Ancient Roman temple and artifacts beneath Bloomberg HQ.
- Barbican Conservatory** – Rare and exotic plants in a stunning indoor garden.
- Tate Britain** – British art from historic to modern.
- National Maritime Museum** – London's seafaring history and family-friendly fun.
- National Army Museum** – The story of the British Army through the ages.



SMALLER FREE ATTRACTIONS

- Sherlock Holmes Statue & Baker Street** – Visit the statue outside Baker Street tube station.
- Covent Garden Street Entertainers** – Enjoy free performances in this bustling market area.
- Twinings Tea Shop** – Sample premium teas and learn about over 300 years of tea heritage.
- Chinatown London** – Wander through vibrant streets, gates and lanterns.
- Harrods** – Explore this iconic store and marvel at its luxury.
- Abbey Road Beatles Crossing** – Walk the famous zebra crossing made iconic by The Beatles.
- The Old Curiosity Shop** – One of London's oldest shops, said to inspire Charles Dickens.
- Peter Pan Statue** – Find J.M. Barrie's Peter Pan in Kensington Gardens.
- London's Lilliputian Police Station** – The smallest police station in London at Trafalgar Square.
- Carnaby Street** – Discover unique boutiques and London's fashion history.
- The Ruins of St. Dunstan-in-the-East** – A peaceful garden in the ruins of a 900-year-old church.
- Goodwins Court** – Step into a hidden, historic street said to inspire Diagon Alley.
- London Wall** – See a surviving Roman wall built around 200 AD.
- The Mayflower Pub** – Visit the oldest pub on the Thames with historic moorings outside.
- Allies Sculpture** – See Churchill and Roosevelt together on a bench.
- Tyburn Tree Marker** – Remember the site of historic public hangings.
