

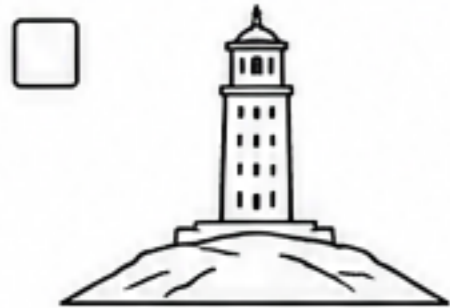

## THINGS TO DO IN LA CORUNA SPAIN

**1. The Tower of Hercules**  
The world's oldest working lighthouse with amazing views over the Atlantic Ocean. Climb to the top, visit the museum and explore the peninsula.



**2. Maria Pita Square – Old Town**  
La Coruna's main square, home to the town hall and a statue of Maria Pita, the city's heroic defender.



**3. Galerias – “The City of Glass”**  
Stunning 19th-century buildings with glass façades and white woodwork along Avenida de la Marina.



**4. Cidade Vella**  
The charming old town with narrow streets, historic squares, churches, shops and cafes. Perfect for wandering.



**5. The Beaches – Orzán and Praia de Riazor**  
Two beautiful urban beaches about a 15-minute walk away. Enjoy the sea views and the 8-mile promenade.



**6. Santiago de Compostela & the Cathedral**  
A popular excursion to this historic city and stunning cathedral, said to hold the tomb of St. James.



**7. Casa Museum Picasso**  
The home where Picasso lived as a child. See period furniture, artworks and learn about his early life.



**8. Casa Museo Maria Pita**  
Step into the life of La Coruna's heroine and discover the city's history in the 16th and 17th centuries.



**9. Iglesia de Santiago Apostol**  
A 12th-century Romanesque church and historic monument in the heart of La Coruna.



**10. Plaza del Humor**  
A fun square with statues of famous comedians and cartoon characters. Great for photos!



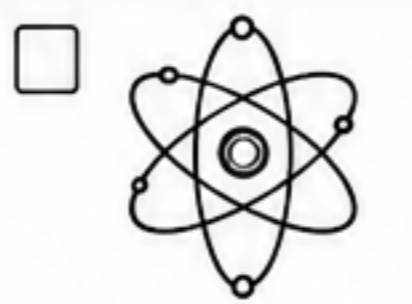
**11. Museo Militar**  
Explore Spain's military history with weapons, uniforms, banners and equipment from the 18th to 20th centuries.



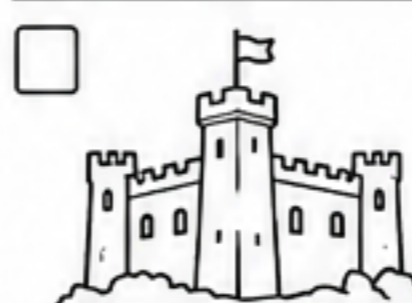
**12. MEGA Museo Estrella Galicia**  
A brewery museum and tour showing the history and process of beer making. End with a freshly poured pint and a visit to the gift shop.



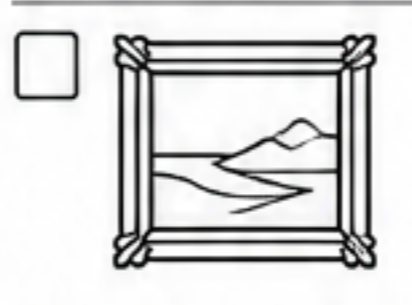
**13. Monte San Pedro**  
Hilltop park with incredible views over the city and coast. Ride the Ascensor Panoramico and visit the dome, maze, café and old guns.



**14. Museo Nacional de Ciencia y Tecnologia**  
Free museum with over 19,000 scientific instruments, technological devices and interactive exhibits.



**15. Museo Arqueologico e Historico**  
Housed in San Anton Castle. Discover artifacts from prehistoric times, Roman finds and Celtic gold jewellery.



**16. Museo de Belas Artes**  
La Coruna's Museum of Fine Arts with over 5,000 works from the 15th century to today. Free entry!



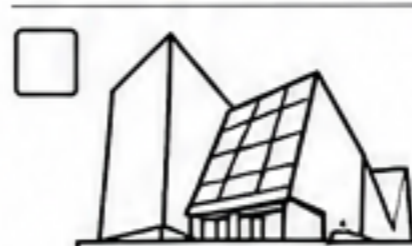
**17. Church of St. George (Iglesia de San Jorge)**  
A beautiful 18th-century Baroque parish church with twin bell towers. Open for services and visitors.



**18. Collegiate Church of Santa Maria do Campo**  
Romanesque church and Museum of Sacred Art with works from the 12th to 15th centuries.



**19. Aquarium Finisterrae**  
Home to the world's largest saltwater pool and fish from the Atlantic and Caribbean.



**20. Museo Domus – Casa del Hombre**  
Museum dedicated to the human being with exhibits on neurons, genetics and evolution.
