## Things to do in Molde Norway



- The Romsdal Museum**

Part indoor, part open-air museum and the largest folk museum in Norway. See historic buildings, a 17th century church, traditional houses and sheds, plus indoor exhibits on local life, art and WWII history. Allow a couple of hours to explore.

- The Varden Hike**

Hike 407 metres above sea level for incredible views of Molde, the fjord and 222 snow clad mountains. The hike takes about 1 hour each way from the town centre. Taxis to the top take about 10 minutes. At the top is the Vardestua restaurant. Check the weather before you go.

- Molde Cathedral**

A gothic style cathedral consecrated in 1957 with beautiful stained-glass windows. It sits on the hillside above the main street and has a 50-metre-high bell tower. Worth a visit if open.

- The Rose Maiden Molde Town Hall**

Outside the Town Hall stands the bronze statue of the Rose Maiden, surrounded by a dancing fountain. A gift to Molde in 1971, she holds a basket of roses. The Town Hall even has a rose garden on its roof.

- Walk Around Molde**

Explore the town on foot! Visit Aker Stadion (stadium of Molde FK) by the waterfront, then enjoy the compact town centre with plenty of shops, cafes and restaurants. A great way to experience local culture and see the sights.

- Møre og Romsdal Art Center**

Contemporary art museum opened in 1978, showcasing Norwegian and international art. Admission is free. Enjoy changing exhibitions plus glass, ceramics and prints.

### ADDITIONAL EXCURSIONS WHICH CAN BE BOOKED

- The Atlantic Ocean Road**

A feat of modern engineering, this series of bridges connects the island of Averøy with the mainland. Enjoy ocean views and stop in the small fishing village of Bud for photos and views of the Bjørnsund Islands. A great way to experience Norway's dramatic coastal weather.
- Bergtatt Marble Caves**

A marble quarry 40 minutes from Molde. Learn about the area from a local guide, then cross a lake by barge into the cave. As it gets lighter you'll see four chandeliers lighting up the stunning marbled walls.
