Things to do in Verona Italy

- 1. Juliet's House – Casa di Giulietta**
Visit the famous courtyard, Juliet's statue and balcony, plus the museum inside the medieval tower house dedicated to the story of Romeo and Juliet.
- 2. Arena di Verona**
Explore this magnificent Roman amphitheatre built around 30 AD. Take a tour or attend an opera in the world-famous open-air venue.
- 3. Piazza Bra**
Verona's largest square with the Arena, Town Hall, cafés along the Liston promenade, a beautiful park and historic buildings.
- 4. Funicolare di Castel San Pietro**
Take the funicular up San Pietro Hill for breathtaking panoramic views of the city, Adige River and surrounding hills.
- 5. Ponte Pietra**
Walk across Verona's oldest bridge, dating from 100 BC, and enjoy views of the river and historic buildings.
- 6. Piazza della Erbe**
The city's oldest square with a daily market, beautiful buildings, fountains, statues and historic monuments.
- 7. Porta Borsari**
An ancient Roman gate from the 1st century AD and the main entrance to the city in Roman times.
- 8. Verona Cathedral**
Visit the Cathedral of Santa Maria Assunta and its complex of churches, with stunning Gothic architecture and artwork.
- 9. Arco dei Gavi**
A 1st-century Roman arch celebrating the Gavia family, with Corinthian columns and beautiful carvings.
- 10. Ponte Scaligero**
Walk this fortified red brick bridge connecting Castelvecchio Castle to the other side of the Adige River.
- 11. Piazza dei Signori**
A historic square with the city council, Scala Family Palace, Loggia del Consiglio and a statue of Dante.
- 12. Teatro Romano**
A 1st-century BC Roman theatre on San Pietro Hill with an adjacent archaeological museum.
- 13. Scaliger Tombs**
The ornate Gothic tombs of the powerful Scaliger family, located in a beautiful fenced courtyard.
- 14. Giardino Giusti**
A stunning 16th-century Renaissance garden with statues, fountains, cypress alleys, a labyrinth and great city views.
- 15. Castelvecchio Museum**
A 13th-century castle housing impressive art collections from the medieval, Renaissance and modern eras.
- 16. Basilica di San Zeno Maggiore**
A Romanesque basilica (967–1398 AD) said to be the crypt where Romeo and Juliet were married.
- 17. Basilica di Sant' Anastasia**
A grand Gothic basilica (1260–1440) with three aisles, red Veronese marble and beautiful artworks.
- 18. Chiesa di San Fermo Maggiore**
A church with two parts: a Romanesque lower church (11th–12th c.) and Gothic upper church (14th c.).
- 19. Santuario della Madonna di Lourdes**
A historic sanctuary on San Leonardo Hill with fascinating history and city views.
- 20. Galleria d'Arte Moderna Achille Forti**
Modern art gallery in Palazzo della Ragione featuring works from the 19th century to today.

21. Palazzo Maffei Casa Museo

Art museum with 700+ works including paintings, sculptures and modern & contemporary art.



22. Museo di Storia Naturale

Natural history museum with exhibits on palaeontology, geology, zoology and local natural heritage.



23. Museo Archeologico Nazionale di Verona

Artifacts from the most significant excavations in Verona, from prehistoric sites to the Roman era.



24. Museo degli Affreschi

Art history museum with frescoes and paintings. Includes a sarcophagus said to be Juliet's tomb.



25. Foundation Museum Miniscalchi Erizzo

Collection of art, antiquities, Renaissance bronzes, ceramics, weapons and Russian icons.
